On September 20 from 2-4 p.m. our VP Hospitality team Susan Bondy and Valerie Casillas are preparing this long-awaited celebration of friendship.




### **OCTOBER 18 LEAGUE/DOCENT JOINT MEETING**

Dr. Nicole Myers, the Barbara Thomas Lemmon Senior Curator of European Art at the Dallas Museum of Art will be sharing her exciting curated exhibition *Van Gogh and the Olive Groves*. It is a focused exhibition co-organized with the Van Gogh Museum, Amsterdam and premiers in Dallas. Dr. Myers will share with us how the olive groves of Provence inspired and influenced the painting style of Van Gogh. In May 1889, Van Gogh resided for a year at the mental asylum in Saint-Remy, Provence. Finding comfort amid the olive trees, Van Gogh sought new ways to express color and line. The experience was intensely personal and spiritual for him. Dr. Myers's lecture will expand on Van Gogh's experience in Saint-Remy, as well as highlight important discoveries regarding his techniques, materials and palette. We are certain to gain a deeper appreciation of Van Gogh's life and work. It will be a day to remember! The meeting will begin at 10:30 a.m.



#### THE ARTIST'S GARDEN


The Artist's Garden features over 20 gardens that have inspired some of the greatest painters of history. From Cezanne's house in the south of France to Childe Hassam at Celia Thaxter's garden off the coast of Maine. Flowers and gardens have often been the first choice for artists looking for a subject. Claude Monet's Giverny was the catalyst for hundreds of great paintings (by Monet and other artists), each one different from the one before. Sometimes a whole village becomes the focus for a colony of artists as at Gerberoy in Picardy and Skagen on the northernmost tip of Denmark. A few artists, including Pierre Bonnard and his neighbor Monet were keen gardeners, as much in love with their plants as their work, while for others like Sorolla in Madrid, his courtyard home was both a sanctuary and a source of ideas.
